Weather

You will all be pleased to note that when my climatological station was inspected on the 1st of October, my thermometers were all found to be within 1 degree, compared to the inspector's thermometer; and my rain gauge was correctly exposed.

The photograph on the cover of the October issue reminded me of the occasional visit my brother and myself made in the late 1940's to Colstoun Mains farm just to the south of Haddington. This farm was the first in Scotland to have a Field Marshall tractor. This had a very distinctive sound, having just one cylinder and a vertical exhaust shaped like a cigar. It was started using a gun cartridge which was inserted into the side of the engine, hit on the head with a hammer, then shot out the side, everyone standing well clear! Soon afterwards a combine harvester arrived which was operated via a linkage from the tractor. The tractor was in fact the second in Scotland. The first being owned by a local agricultural contractor, Wylie's, which was located less than half a mile from my house in Station Road. Previous to this Wylie's operated steam traction engines which would trundle through the town, hauling a thrashing mill, boiler, and a four wheel caravan and a small trailer, bringing up the rear. Quite a sight!

Toffee Apples

1 lb (450 g) Demerara (raw) sugar
2 oz (50 g) butter
2 tsp vinegar
2/3 cup (150 ml) 1/4 water
1 tbsp golden syrup (substitute light corn syrup)
6-8 medium apples
6-8 wooden sticks



Method

Gently heat the sugar, butter, vinegar, water and syrup in a heavy-based saucepan until the sugar has dissolved and the butter has melted.

Boil rapidly for 5 minutes until a drop of the mixture placed in cold water separates into threads which become hard but not brittle.

Wash and dry the apples and impale on the sticks.

Dip each one into the toffee mixture, swirling it around, so that the excess toffee drips back into the saucepan.

Leave to cool on a buttered baking sheet.
